Prague Castle is not only a beautiful complex of historical monuments, but also a place that is closely connected with the political and legal developments of our country. Within these walls are reflected both great and tragic events. Walt Disney studied at the Academy of Fine Arts in Chicago and began his career as a cartoonist in 1920. In 1928 Disney created the character Mickey Mouse in the silent film *Plane Crazy*. That same year Mickey also (A) appeared in *Steamboat Willie*, a short that commenced the concept of making a separate cartoon for each animated movement. He also experimented with the use of music, sound, the portrayal of speed, three-dimensional effects, and the use of color. Disney produced the first feature-length cartoon, *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs* (1938), (B) which took three years to complete.

Disney and his productions received numerous Academy and other awards during his lifetime. After his death, the Disney studios (C) were remained spry, diversified, and ultimately became enormously successful. In the early 1980s, they began producing films for adults.

Disneyland, a humongous theme park in Anaheim, California, (D) was opened by Disney in 1955. Disney's California Adventure, a second, smaller theme park in Anaheim, opened adjacent to Disneyland in 2001. An even bigger park, Walt Disney World, opened near Orlando, Florida, in 1971 as a theme park and resort, and Epcot Center, Disney-MGM Studios, and Animal Kingdom (E) have since been added. Disneyland parks have also opened near Tokyo (1983) and in Mame-la-Valle, near Paris (1992).
