Until the late 19th century, police had no formal system of identifying those who had previously been convicted of crimes. Simply by using an alias, a criminal could hide the fact that he was a repeat offender. To solve this problem, French researcher Alphonse Bertillon devised a scheme based on photographic portraits, or “mugshots,” and comprehensive physical descriptions. When a person was arrested, police would obtain detailed physical measurements, note distinctive physical features, and take carefully arranged photographs. The resulting material would be filed away and then used to establish the identities of those involved in later cases. Although police today have a far greater range of tools at their disposal, they remain indebted to Bertillon for his efforts to \_\_\_\_\_ (A).

The American pilot Charles Lindbergh is best known for making the first nonstop solo flight across the Atlantic Ocean. He used the financial backing of several prominent investors in his hometown of St. Louis, Missouri, to pay the Ryan Airline Company in San Diego to construct his iconic plane, the *Spirit of St. Louis*.

When the plane was complete, it was brought to Lindbergh’s departure point of Long Island, New York. After being delayed for several days in Long Island due to inclement weather, Lindbergh finally took off on May 20, 1927. The “great circle” route that he had **charted** would take him along the coast of Newfoundland, Canada, and then over the Atlantic Ocean and Ireland, before ending in Paris, France.

His altitude ranged from merely a few feet above sea level during the day to over 10,000 feet at night. According to Lindbergh, he spent much of the flight struggling to see. He was forced to contend with thick fog and clouds. \_\_\_\_\_ (A), the plane’s front window area had been replaced with a gasoline tank to minimize weight, leaving him reliant on a mirrored instrument on the side of his plane to see ahead. Fortunately, in the late evening of May 21, 1927, he landed safely in Paris, 33.5 hours after takeoff.

Questions 37-40 are based on the following passage.

When the Maya empire fell to the Spanish in the 16th century, numerous documents written in the Maya script were destroyed. In addition, Mayans were forced to learn the Latin alphabet and to speak only in Spanish. As a result, the script that the Mayans had used prior to invasion eventually became **impenetrable**.

The first to try to decode the Maya script were the conquistadors themselves. One of their number, Diego de Landa, described the script as an alphabet, having assumed that its symbols were analogous to the phonetic symbols of the Latin alphabet. By the 20th century, however, the (A) view was that the script was a pictographic system—that is, each of its symbols stood not for a single sound but for a whole word or idea.

Then, in the 1950s, a Russian linguist named Yuri Knorozov chanced upon a replica of a Mayan text. Approaching the symbols with a fresh pair of eyes, Knorozov concluded that there were too few to form a pictographic system but too many to form an alphabet. Instead, he realized, each of them represented a syllable, or a compound of vowels and consonants. While Knorozov’s research met with resistance at first, it eventually came to be recognized as a pivotal contribution to the understanding of the script.
